I want to thank those families for supporting our student body fundraising drive. To date, our portion of the proceeds is \$24,000! We are about \$6,000 short of our goal, and this is a big weekend to get those last minute subscriptions from family and friends. Speaking of student council funded assemblies, we are very excited for our 7th graders to experience our Core 3 assemblies on September 10 (Mountaineers) and 17 (Golden Bears). The assemblies are meant to build empathy amongst our community. More information will be coming home to you through our counselor, Dee Cutter. CORE 3 is a day-long workshop designed to focus on character, connection, and culture. Students will be led through a workshop experience to discover more about themselves, their strengths and weaknesses, and how they can be used in a leadership capacity. CORE 3 is facilitated by a trained staff, who partners with your school staff and administrators, seeking to equip students to discover who they are, where they belong and how to use their passions and strengths to be agents of change. When your 7th grader attends this assembly, it would be great for you to have a conversation that night about the day. In case you're in need, here are some possible conversation starters (feel free to call us with any questions or concerns):

- Tell me about the CORE 3 Workshop.
- What do you think people learned from attending?
- What did you learn about yourself from attending?

### **NOTICE FROM EDH LIBRARY**

As a reminder, the El Dorado Hills Library at 7455 Silva Valley Road has a no school pickup/drop-off policy for the safety of all students walking and biking home. The library parking lot is for library use only and library staff will be monitoring the area.

## NURSES NEWS



### WELCOME BACK – Let’s have a healthy year!!

To keep your child healthy or safe at school, do they need medications? **Does your child have a rescue medication such as epinephrine or an inhaler?** Often daily medications are needed at school... If so, read below about medications. Some students may have medical conditions, such as history of seizures, heart condition or significant medical concern. Please make sure that our health staff is aware of any medical condition that may warrant a health plan. An individualized student health plan (ISHP) will provide first aid guidelines to staff. We have two nurses to assist with a plan and a health clerk that works daily at each site.

**MEDICATIONS:** **Every new school year, we are required to obtain a new medication permission form completed by a medical provider WITH a parent/guardian’s signature. This includes Over-The-Counter (OTC) medications, and ALL prescription medications – even for emergencies such as Epi-Pens or inhalers. If you have a copy of a prescription or medical record that shows this medication, you may SIGN OUR FORM and provide the records for review to see if we can utilize this.** Be sure to indicate if your child can carry permissible emergency medications, such as epinephrine, diabetic supplies or inhaler. The medication form alerts our two District Nurses to review for a potential health plan and to add medical alerts for staff.

**What else to expect this school year?** Screenings are performed as mandated ensuring children are at optimal health to learn. Hearing or vision concerns, chronic dental pain or other medical conditions can be a barrier to learning. Let us help your child stay healthy and succeed at school. **SCREENINGS include:** Hearing and vision screening mandated **at a minimum** of grades K, 2, 5 and 8 and all students new to our district. Hearing services are provided by the “hearing van” or the nurses. Vision screening is conducted by a school nurse. Scoliosis screening occurs in the spring for 7<sup>th</sup> grade girls and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys by our school nurses. An oral health examination and a physical are required for the child’s first year of school that should be obtained by the parent (forms can be obtained at each health office and are included in enrollment packets). *You will only be notified of any concerns should your child have results that are considered to be “abnormal” or a “failed screening”.* Thank you for your understanding!!

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Dear Rolling Hills Parents,

The Buckeye Union School District will be conducting assessments of students in October to determine GATE (Gifted and Talented Education) eligibility. Although the program opportunities for GATE students are limited as the State provides little funding for GATE, the Buckeye Union School District is continuing its process of identification and, for those that qualify, some opportunities for enrichment/support in and out of the classroom continue to be provided.

GATE identified students have been provided a differential learning plan in afterschool clubs for GATE students where they can spend time researching, playing games, and using the computer to explore intellectual outlets.

In order for a student to qualify for GATE, they must take the OLSAT (Otis Lennon School Ability Test), which measures the cognitive skills that relate to a student's ability to learn and succeed in school and examines both verbal and nonverbal abilities. A student needs to score in the 95th percentile on the OLSAT in order to qualify for GATE. This means that only approximately 5 of every 100 students taking the OLSAT will be GATE identified.

The OLSAT exam will be offered to student's grade 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> at Rolling Hills Middle School during the school day, **October 23, 2019**, and will take approximately 1 hour.

In the past, students have been qualified to take the OLSAT exam by either a high score in the advanced range of a state standardized test or through a teacher recommendation process. Currently, the OLSAT assessment is open for students to take based on parent recommendation and student interest. When determining whether or not your child should take this rigorous test please consider the following guidelines:

- Does your child appear to have exceptionally strong intellectual skills for a student their age?
- Have teachers previously reported to you that your child demonstrates exceptionally well developed intellectual skills?

If the answer to one or both of these questions is yes, then they may be a good candidate for participating.

If your student participates and performs in the top 5% on the OLSAT, they will be identified as GATE eligible and will receive further communication from your school site regard enrichments and supports that are offered.

If you would like to have your child take the OLSAT test please complete the attached permission form and return it to your school office by **September 27, 2019**. If there are any questions about whether to permit your child to participate in the OLSAT exam please contact your student's teacher or site principal.

**\*Please note - if your child was previously tested, and GATE identified, he/she does not need to retake the test each year.**


